She read Engineering at Cambridge University, and achieved Chartered Engineer status. She subsequently lectured in electronics, developed a highly successful IT company, and campaigned on climate change issues. After working as Responsible Retail Lead at Accenture, she wanted to focus on how to make the UK fashion industry more sustainable and is now the Institute of Positive Fashion lead at the British Fashion Council.</p>	<p>Anna Brightman</p>  <p>Co-founder, UpCircle Beauty</p> <p>When Anna discovered that more than 500,000 tonnes of coffee grounds consumed each year in the UK alone are sent to landfill, she decided to start collecting coffee from cafes across London and transforming them into skincare products. Since launching 4 years ago UpCircle Beauty has saved over 275 tonnes of coffee. The brand also rescues and reuses ingredients from the argan, tea, juice, date, olive and wood industries.</p>	<p>Virginia Cinquemani</p>  <p>Director and Founder, Green Gorilla Consultants Ltd</p> <p>Virginia is a qualified architect, project manager, environmental consultant, trainer and coach.
